

The college's Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) focuses on maintaining quality standards. To achieve this, they collect feedback from students, teachers, alumni, and employers using a structured rating-based form. This feedback plays a crucial role in shaping the college's curriculum and enriching the learning experience. In the 2021-22 session, Sree Narayana College carefully analysed this feedback, showcasing its dedication to continuous improvement and ensuring a high-quality education for its students.

STUDENT FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The feedback form included 10 questions addressing topics like syllabus depth, real-life relevance, learning benefits, clarity of materials, and motivation for further studies. Students rated each question with four options: Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, and Poor. This feedback is crucial for improving the curriculum's quality and relevance.

The analysis of student feedback for the academic year 2021-22 shows that the curriculum is largely well-received, with many students rating it as excellent or good in terms of relevance to real life, learning value, and overall quality. A significant majority of respondents (78.5%) rated the depth of the syllabus as either—excellent or good, indicating strong satisfaction with the comprehensiveness of the syllabus. The curriculum's coverage was rated positively by 82.6% of respondents. The relevance of the curriculum to real-life situations was rated highly by 80.1% of students. The learning value in terms of knowledge, skills, and abilities received positive feedback from 80.6% of respondents. Clarity and relevance of reading materials were considered good by 77% of respondents. The relevance of library materials was well-received, with 80.6% of students rating it as excellent or good. The curriculum's ability to motivate students to pursue higher studies was rated positively by 82% of respondents. The curriculum's attention to student requirements received high marks from 84% of respondents. The curriculum's relevance in empowering students to handle modern life challenges was rated positively by 80.4% of respondents. The overall curriculum was rated highly by 79.5% of students as good. The 7.6% poor rating highlights areas that may need improvement to enhance overall satisfaction.


TEACHER FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

This provides a comprehensive analysis of teacher feedback on the curriculum, focusing on various aspects critical to its effectiveness and relevance. The feedback was collected through a google form designed to evaluate the academic content, experiential methods, and overall design of the curriculum.

A significant majority of respondents provided positive feedback on the curriculum, reflecting a high level of satisfaction. The academic content of the syllabus received favourable ratings from 80.3% of respondents. The effectiveness of experiential methods in making the subject meaningful was endorsed by 78.5% of respondents. The curriculum's design in extending the subject to industrial and societal needs received positive feedback from 76.5%. The provisions for professional development were well-regarded by 79.5% of respondents. In terms of interdisciplinary learning, the curriculum was highly rated by 82% of respondents. The syllabus's allowance for new teaching strategies received 75% of all responses as good. The relevance and appropriateness of the prescribed reference materials were positively assessed by 80.3%. However, the adequacy of time given to teachers for syllabus completion was viewed less favourably, with 73% of all responses rating it as good. The curriculum's relevance to real life situations and current trends was positively rated by 79% of respondents. The overall curriculum was rated highly by 78.5% of respondents, with 34% rating it as excellent and 44.5% as good. The 7.3% poor rating indicates areas where improvements could be made to enhance overall satisfaction and effectiveness.




ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The alumni feedback form consists of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level of the alumni about the syllabus. Given below are the conclusions obtained by analyzing the alumni feedback for the academic year 2021 - 2022.

The feedback shows that the curriculum is generally well-received, with most responses falling under "Excellent" or "Good." Notably, the content is considered appropriate for higher education (87% rated as Excellent/Good) and effective in achieving its objectives and learning outcomes (88%). It also enhances knowledge and skills (88%) and promotes critical thinking (87%), though slightly lower scores in self-study and research attitude (81%) suggest room for growth in encouraging independent learning. The integration of crosscutting issues and employability weightage are strong (88.5% and 92% respectively), though slight improvements could be made in areas like varied skill options and professional ethics. Overall, the feedback indicates a positive curriculum with minor areas for enhancement.

The combined percentages of "Excellent" and "Very Good" ratings illustrate a strong overall positive perception of graduates' competencies. Attributes such as communication and collaboration, adaptability, and teamwork effectiveness all exceed 75%, indicating that graduates are highly regarded for their ability to work effectively in team environments and tackle challenges. This strong performance in key skills suggests that graduates are not only capable but also prepared to excel in dynamic workplace settings.

However, while the percentages are encouraging, they also reveal some areas for growth. Attributes like planning and organization skills and innovativeness are slightly lower but still above 70%, indicating that while graduates have a solid foundation, there is room for further development. The consistent presence of ratings in the "Average" and "Poor" categories for some attributes suggests that targeted interventions in training and curriculum design could enhance these areas. Overall, the feedback reflects a promising outlook for graduates but emphasizes the importance of continuous improvement to ensure they meet and exceed industry expectations.
