Students, Teachers, Alumni & Employer 2022-23



The college's Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) focuses on maintaining quality standards. To achieve this, they collect feedback from students, teachers, alumni, and employers using a structured rating-based form. This feedback plays a crucial role in shaping the college's curriculum and enriching the learning experience. In the 2022-23 session, Sree Narayana College carefully analysed this feedback, showcasing its dedication to continuous improvement and ensuring a high-quality education for its students.

STUDENT FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The feedback form included 10 questions addressing topics like syllabus depth, real-life relevance, learning benefits, clarity of materials, and motivation for further studies. Students rated each question with four options: Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, and Poor. This feedback is crucial for improving the curriculum's quality and relevance.

The analysis of student feedback for the academic year 2022-2023 shows that the curriculum is largely well-received, with many students rating it as excellent or good in terms of relevance to real life, learning value, and overall quality. A significant majority of respondents (79.3%) rated the depth of the syllabus as either—excellent or good, indicating strong satisfaction with the comprehensiveness of the syllabus. The curriculum's coverage was rated positively by 83.6% of respondents. The relevance of the curriculum to real-life situations was rated highly by 80.3% of students. The learning value in terms of knowledge, skills, and abilities received positive feedback from 81% of respondents. Clarity and relevance of reading materials were considered good by 77.3% of respondents. The relevance of library materials was well-received, with 80.8% of students rating it as excellent or good. The curriculum's ability to motivate students to pursue higher studies was rated positively by 82.3% of respondents. The curriculum's relevance in empowering students to handle modern life challenges was rated positively by 80.3% of respondents. The overall curriculum was rated highly by 79% of students as good. The 8.2% poor rating highlights areas that may need improvement to enhance overall satisfaction.


TEACHER FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

This provides a comprehensive analysis of teacher feedback on the curriculum, focusing on various aspects critical to its effectiveness and relevance. The feedback was collected through a google form designed to evaluate the academic content, experiential methods, and overall design of the curriculum.

A significant majority of respondents provided positive feedback on the curriculum, reflecting a high level of satisfaction. The academic content of the syllabus received favorable ratings from 82.5% of respondents. The effectiveness of experiential methods in making the subject meaningful was endorsed by 79.2% of respondents. The curriculum's design in extending the subject to industrial and societal needs received positive feedback from 76%. The provisions for professional development were well-regarded by 81.5% of respondents. In terms of interdisciplinary learning, the curriculum was highly rated by 84.3% of respondents. The syllabus's allowance for new teaching strategies received 75% of all responses as good. The relevance and appropriateness of the prescribed reference materials were positively assessed by 81%. However, the adequacy of time given to teachers for syllabus completion was viewed less favorably, with 73% of all responses rating it as good. The curriculum's relevance to real life situations and current trends was positively rated by 80% of respondents. The overall curriculum was rated highly by 82.5% of respondents, with 38.5% rating it as excellent and 43% as good. The 5.5% Poor rating indicates areas where improvements could be made to enhance overall satisfaction and effectiveness.


ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The alumni feedback form consists of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level of the alumni about the syllabus. Given below are the conclusions obtained by analyzing the alumni feedback for the academic year 2022 - 2023.

The feedback indicates that the curriculum is well-regarded overall, with "Good" ratings consistently surpassing 50% across most attributes, reflecting a positive reception. The highest ratings are seen in curriculum attainment of objectives (54.5% "Good") and the curriculum's effectiveness in promoting critical thinking (55.3% "Good"). Additionally, weightage to employability is strong (52.6% "Good"), showing alignment with career preparation. However, areas like the integration of crosscutting issues (56.7% "Good") and self-study promotion (50.4% "Good") still have room for improvement despite solid scores. "Excellent" ratings fall below 30%, suggesting a relatively low perception of exceptional performance across attributes, and a notable portion of feedback (averaging 9-10%) lands in "Satisfactory," indicating room for refinement, particularly in fostering varied skill options and enhancing knowledge.

Overall, while the curriculum is viewed positively, there's potential to shift more "Satisfactory" ratings into higher tiers by focusing on enhancing critical thinking, skill variety, and crosscutting issues integration.
